Auditor-General's Department Prize for Accounting Systems and Data Analytics

Establishment

This prize was established by a contribution to the University by the Auditor-General's Department to recognise and support students studying accounting systems and data analytics.

The donor has agreed to donate \$600 annually to the University for three years from 2023-2025 (awarded in 2024, 2025 and 2026).

The Prize will no longer be awarded if the donor ceases financial support of the Prize.

Title

1. The Prize shall be called the "Auditor-General's Department Prize for Accounting Systems and Data Analytics".

Value

2. The value of the prize shall be \$600.00.

Eligibility

3. To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must have successfully completed the undergraduate course *ACCTING 2503 Accounting Systems and Data Analytics* in the year for which the Prize is awarded.
4. Candidates are ineligible if they:-
 - have provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize;
 - have been found guilty of misconduct by the Student Misconduct Tribunal and have had relevant penalties imposed on them in accordance with the University's Policies Rules and Statutes for Student Misconduct.

Selection of Candidate

5. The Prize will be awarded annually to the student who obtains the highest mark in the course stated above as determined by the Coursework Scholarships Office.
6. If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, preference may be given to the candidate deemed the most outstanding, considering aptitude, enthusiasm and participation as determined by the School.

Administration and Variations

7. The prize shall be administered by the Coursework Scholarships Office with the School undertaking grade verification.
8. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
9. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize if the Student Misconduct Tribunal has found the student guilty of misconduct and imposed a relevant penalty, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has

a relationship to the awarding of this Prize in accordance with the University's Policies Rules and Statutes for Student Misconduct.

10. Once the Prize has been withdrawn for that year, it may be re-awarded to the next eligible student at the discretion of the School/Faculty and subject to available funding.
