Rules



Dr Ankit Agarwal Prize for Applying Management Theoretical Concepts in Life

Establishment

This prize has been established by a contribution to the University by Dr Ankit Agarwal, who is an academic staff member at the Adelaide Business School. The prize reflects his passion for scholarship and learning and teaching theories by linking them to life experiences at the University of Adelaide. In particular, the prize recognises the high value placed upon applying theories learned in class to life experiences outside the classroom to make sense of who we are and why we act in the ways we do.

In support of the prize, the donor has agreed to donate the prize amount annually to the University for five years from 2024 – 2028. The Prize will be awarded annually in 2025, 2026, 2027, 2028 and 2029.

The Prize will no longer be awarded if the donor ceases financial support of the Prize.

Title

1. The prize shall be known as the "Dr Ankit Agarwal Prize for Applying Management Theoretical Concepts in Life."

Value

2. The value of the Prize shall be \$1,000.00.

Eligibility

- 3. To be eligible for the Prize, candidates must have successfully completed their first year of the Bachelor of Business and have successfully completed *COMMGMT 1001 Managing Organisations and People* in the year for which the Prize is awarded.
- 4. Candidates are ineligible if they: -
 - have provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.
 - have been found guilty of misconduct by the Student Misconduct Tribunal and have had relevant penalties imposed on them in accordance with the University's Policies, Rules and Statutes for Student Misconduct.

Selection of Candidate

- 5. The Prize shall be awarded annually to the eligible candidate who receives the highest mark for the best reflective assignment in the course *COMMGMT 1001 Managing Organisations and People* on a topic relating to Management, and has demonstrated excellence in the area of writing as determined by a Selection Panel consisting of:
 - a. the Dean of Business, Adelaide Business School (or nominee)
 - b. two senior academic members of the Adelaide Business School.
- 6. The student must demonstrate through writing how they have applied theoretical concepts they have learned in *COMMGMT 1001 Managing Organisations and People*. First, to understand their life experiences and make sense of them. Second, to ensure they are able to reflect on their ways of behaving in different situations in life and the value of applying theories to their life experiences.
- 7. If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year, then the prize will not be awarded in that year.

Rules



Administration and Variations

- 8. The prize shall be administered by the Coursework Scholarships Office.
- 9. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
- 10. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize if the Student Misconduct Tribunal has found the student guilty of misconduct and imposed a relevant penalty, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize in accordance with the University's Policies, Rules and Statutes for Student Misconduct.
- 11. Once the Prize has been withdrawn for that year, it may be re-awarded to the next eligible student at the discretion of the School/Faculty and subject to available funding.
