Hender Consulting Prize for Managing Organisational Behaviour

Establishment

This prize has been established by a contribution to the University by Hender Consulting who are establishing the prize to recognise and support postgraduate coursework students in the Adelaide Business School.

The donor has agreed to donate the prize amount annually to the University for five years from 2023-2027. The Prize will be awarded in 2024, 2025, 2026, 2027 and 2028.

The prize will no longer be awarded if the donor ceases financial support of the Prize.

Title

1. The prize shall be called the "Hender Consulting Prize for Managing Organisational Behaviour."

Value

2. The value of the prize shall be \$1,000.00.

Eligibility

3. To be eligible for the prize candidates must have successfully completed the course *MANAGEMENT 7087 – Managing Organisational Behaviour* in the year for which the Prize is awarded.
4. Candidates are ineligible if they: -
 - have provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize;
 - have been found guilty of misconduct by the Student Misconduct Tribunal and have had relevant penalties imposed on them in accordance with the University's Policies, Rules and Statutes for Student Misconduct.

Selection of Candidate

5. The Prize shall be awarded annually to the eligible candidate who obtained the highest mark in the course stated above as determined by the Coursework Scholarships Office.
6. If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the Prize will not be awarded in that year and the funds may be used in a subsequent year (or as agreed with the donor).
7. If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, preference may be given to the candidate who is deemed the most outstanding candidate taking into consideration aptitude, enthusiasm and participation as determined by the School.

Administration and Variations

8. The Prize will be administered by the Coursework Scholarships Office with the School undertaking grade verification.
9. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
10. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize if the Student Misconduct Tribunal has found the student guilty of misconduct and imposed a relevant penalty,

including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize in accordance with the University's Policies, Rules and Statutes for Student Misconduct.

11. Once the Prize has been withdrawn for that year, it may be re-awarded to the next eligible student at the discretion of the School/Faculty and subject to available funding.
